NEWS AT HALFWAY CREEK-CONT. VISION BOARD MINUTES-MARCH 19, 2015

Meeting was called to order at 6:37 pm by President David Gates.

Pastor led us in a devotion using the book, "Eyes Remade for Wonder" by Lawrence Kushner. She read the essay, "Messenger of the Most High" and we reflected on it.

A recommendation via email from Lynn Wegner and John Daily from the Second Century Committee was presented to the Vision Board to approve work to install sound equipment for the narthex and fellowship hall in the building addition. The reason for this approval before the March 19th Vision Board meeting was so the sound equipment could be installed before Easter. Brian Mueller made a motion to approve that work move forward. Susan Chase seconded. Motion was approved via email vote on February 27. The contract to be signed will be provided when received from Sims Audio.

A recommendation via email from Pastor Jean from the Second Century Committee was presented to the Vision Board to approve a contract for Advanced Seamless to install gutters on the new addition for \$2404.00, and a contract for Blinds by Design to install window treatments in the new addition for \$4.607.00. It was presented before the March 19 Vision Board meeting so that work can begin as soon as possible. Brian Mueller made a motion to approve the contracts. Joanne Nichols seconded. Motion was approved via email vote on March 6.

The Property Team presented an estimate to have new gutters and downspouts installed on the existing building at the same time gutters are installed on the building addition. The estimate to do that is \$2,368.00. Marna Holley made a motion to approve using \$1,882.60 from the Property Team budget and \$485.40 from Undesignated Memorials. Joanne Nichols seconded. Motion approved.

The IT Committee recommended approval of a contract with Access PTS for WiFi and network switch equipment for \$2,333.11. Marna Holley made a motion to approve. Joanne Nichols seconded. Motion approved.

The IT Committee recommended bundling phone and internet services with Charter Communications for \$175.00 per month. Brian Mueller made a motion to approve. Marna Holley seconded, Motion was approved.

The Vision Board questioned what team would be responsible for the maintenance of the audio equipment installed by Sims Audio and Video. We will ask Aaron Balow from the IT committee and Lynn Wegner from Music and Liturgy for guidance.

Carolyn Hackett presented the following payment recommendations from the Second Century Committee for the building project: Change Order #19 for \$876.25, Change order #20 for \$467.25, and Change Order #21. Marna Holley made a motion to approve. Susan Chase seconded. Motion was approved.

Owner-direct purchases and assorted invoices (County Materials \$8162.35, First Supply 4652.93, Temperature Systems Inc \$5310.00, Vyron Corp \$1200.00, Wisconsin Building Supply \$18,079.36, Wisconsin Building Supply \$13,076.00, Sherwin Williams \$100.19, Menards \$207.65, Home Depot \$10.00, GexPro \$4495.00, Sims Sound and Video \$4,903.04, Carolyn Hackett-Electricty Expense Reimbursement \$250.00) were presented for payment. Bob Bandoli made a motion to approve, Susan Chase seconded. Motion was approved.

Pay Application for Olympic Builders for \$77,072.20. Bob Bandoli made a motion to approve. Marna Holley seconded. Motion was approved.



Living A Life of Gratitude

Gratitude is the intentional appreciation of what and who you have in your life. Feeling appreciation or being thankful (gratitude) actually has been proven by research to have many health benefits.

What are some of the benefits of practicing gratitude?

- --A decrease in depression. This occurs by practicing optimistic thinking and reframing events or situations in positive ways.
- -- Can be a brain booster. May help strengthen your memory.
- --Helps improve your sleep.
- --Helps you feel peaceful and helps reduce anxiety.
- -Great for your heart. Improves overall cardiac health, indirectly through improving mood, paying attention to positive health behaviors-such as nutrition and exercise. It can also directly affect your heart through reduction in inflammation, which plays a role in many chronic illnesses.

How can you cultivate an attitude of gratitude?

- --Take time to reflect on your day—this can help you intentionally think about the positive parts of your day.
- -- Prayer-prayers or meditations of gratitude are powerful. This can heighten your sense of well-being.
- -- Utilize your senses—your senses connect you to your world and wonders around you. Using your senses can trigger many feelings of gratitude.
- -Visual reminders—use reminders such as notes, pictures, quotes to remember to practice gratitude.
- --Write—whether in a journal about daily events or things that you are grateful for or by writing a letter, expressing feelings of gratitude, or kindness that has been shown to you (even if you don't send the letter.)
- --Think about someone or something you are grateful for—make a conscious decision to spend some time during or at the end of your day to think about a person or event that has brought you love, kindness, joy or compassion.
- -Go back to basics- Don't underestimate the simple things like a sunrise, a soft rain, a kind word, the smell of fresh baked apple pie....the list is endless.

Like all changes in our lives, practicing a life of gratitude takes some time. By consciously taking the time to think about the things in our day-to-day lives that brings us peacefulness, happiness and thankfulness can, over time, help to shift our attitude. You may feel more contented and fulfilled. You may feel more energetic from a spiritual, emotional and physical perspective. You may be happy to be alive!

On behalf of the Outreach Team, Carolyn Hackett presented an update on the new program Sharing Food With All. Outreach Team has developed an informational brochure and is coordinating with Evangelism and Discipleship Team to spread the word about the program and Scrip opportunity. The program will launch on April 12, 2015, with a competition between the Sunday School/Youth and the Congregation to collect donations. The competition will end on May 10th. The community launch with Holmen Lutheran Church and Journey Lutheran Church is planned for June 7th. The program will coordinate through Halfway Creek Lutheran Church. The program will be re-evaluated in October.

The secretary's report was presented. Bob Bandoli made a motion to approve the minutes from the February meeting. Joanne Nichols seconded. Motion was approved.

Bob Bandoli presented the Finance Team report. Building Fund 261.51 is now receiving dedicated building funds to build up balance to begin paying back building project loan.

The Pastor presented her report. Anna Mally received her 90 Day review on March 16, and will receive the \$0.50 raise promised in her contract. Pastor met with Rich Pedretti concerning his duties with the building addition. They came up with a plan to convert Rich to hourly rate, at \$15/hr, starting June 1st and running to February 1st, 2016, or whenever a contract is put in place. This will allow time to evaluate his additional responsibilities. Brian Mueller made a motion to accept that arrangement. Marna Holley seconded. Motion was approved.

With the building addition, custodial fees for special events will increase. The fee for a wedding or funeral will be \$150.00. The fee for an event that uses only the basement or only the fellowship hall will be \$75.00. The fee for an event that utilizes both will be \$150.00.

Chad Brandau of C & C Lawn Mowing, LLC submitted his bid to mow and trim the grounds. Approval of his bid of \$12.50/hr is pending him supplying a certificate of insurance coverage.

Average attendance so far this year is 144 per Sunday.

The Evangelism and Discipleship Team is excited to get started on restructuring the new member process and materials. Susan Chase and Marna Holley will be working with the team alongside Pastor Jean.

Dave Gates spoke with Amy Noel about our Synod Mission commitment. She is willing to make a presentation about what Synod Missions is all about and why we should support it. Dave will coordinate with Amy on dates. The Vision Board is inviting Amy to the next meeting to present her ideas to us.

Bob Bandoli and Rhonda Britton will put together an announcement concerning the importance of designating our offerings.

Marna presented a several ideas for the new church logo. The Vision Board sent four main ideas back with her to work with for the next meeting. We would like to see large scale, small scale, color, back and white, vertical, and horizontal examples of each.

Brian Mueller inquired if there were any members who have grant writing or grant research experience in order to possibly start a Grants Team. Tabled.

Brian Mueller requested permission to set up an Accessibility Committee to start a conversation about how the church can be made more accessible to members who have physical, hearing, vision, and cognitive challenges.

Bob Bandoli made a motion to adjourn. Brian Mueller seconded. Meeting adjourned at 9:18pm.
