#### W-ELCA Purpose Statement

"Of All Generations – Grandma, We've Grown Up" was the theme of the 2016 W-ELCA La Crosse Area Synod Spring Convention held April 16th at Westby Coon Prairie Lutheran Church. The 9:00am call to worship was led by Bishop Jim Arends and Pastor Julie Wollman. This year's event was called to order by President Kathleen Sumrall. Just under 100 people were in attendance.

The Churchwide President's Representative was Lisa Plorin, a longtime member of New Hope Lutheran Church in Upham, North Dakota. Lisa gave a stirring talk of how the Women of the ELCA is an exciting organization empowered by the Holy Spirit. She encouraged all to look forward to the 2017 Triennial in the Cities as well as engage in the many activities and opportunities the women of the ELCA provides. For ThankOffering this year, she suggests we all pledge \$30 for our almost 30 years of being the ELCA. She also suggested we all pledge \$30 for our regular W-ELCA offerings.

The Keynote Speaker of the convention was Bishop Emerita April Larson. Bishop Larson and her husband Judd have retired to Decorah, Iowa where they serve as interim pastors. The Bishop shared how she was called to be a pastor back in 1972. Women were first ordained by the

Lutheran church in 1970, and Bishop Larson has truly seen the changes in our church throughout the years since.

A beautiful salad luncheon was served and hosted by the women of Westby Coon Prairie Lutheran Church. Fellowship and various displays were made available to all. Following the luncheon the convention continued with the business of our synod's W-ELCA.

The day's events also included "Speakouts" by Sheila Champlin from Sugar Creek Bible Camp, Pastor Ben Morris from Campus Ministry, Sandra Hoeser from La Crosse Task Force to Eradicate Modern Slavery who spoke on Human Trafficking, and Cindy Halverson from Lutheran Social Services.

At the Spring Convention, Bishop Emerita April Larson told about her daughter-in-law Renee Splichal Larson's new book that came out in March, <u>A</u>

Witness: The Haiti Earthquake, a Song, Death, and Resurrection.

The 2010 earthquake in Haiti buried Renee Splichal Larson in concrete rubble, killing her husband and leaving her a widow at age 27. Surviving only to be overwhelmed by loss and trauma, she wondered if life was still possible for her. Even as she trained to become a pastor, her faith in a loving God was shaken and battered by the earthquake that devastated Port-au-Prince and took the lives of many thousands.

This is Renee's moving story of love, grief, survival, and new life. It is an account of the lives of three young people, their experience of the challenges, beauty, and hospitality of Haiti, and the tumult that overthrew all they held dear.

After years of struggle and healing, aided by remarkable signs of the love and presence of God, Renee offers us an intimate look at her young


romance, her experience of the earthquake, and the journey that followed. Most of all, she proclaims her hard-won witness: that in Christ, love and life conquer death.

#### **President's Letter**

Dear Sisters in Christ,

I pray you are well and that God has blessed all of your activities. Last month we learned about Lydia. An intelligent faithful woman that Paul brought to know Jesus. Today I want to share about Tabitha.


Acts 9:35-42 Now in Joppa there was a disciple named Tabitha (which translated in Greek means Dorcus); this woman was abounding with deeds of kindness and charity which she continually did. And as it happened at that time she became sick and died; and they washed her body and laid it in an upper room. Since Lydia was near Joppa the disciples, having heard that Peter was there, sent two men to him, imploring him: "Do not delay in coming to us." So Peter arose and went with them. When he arrived they brought him into the upper room, and all the widows stood beside him weeping, and showing all the tunics and garments that Dorcus used to make while she was with them. But Peter sent them all out and knelt down and prayed, and turning to the body, he said, "Tabitha, arise." And she opened her eyes and when she saw Peter, she sat up and he gave her his hand and raised her up; and calling the saints and widows, he presented her alive.

I first heard this story in Sunday School and the picture of Tabitha (or Dorcus) was of an old woman. But I do not think she was old, she was a true disciple. Certainly she inspires us all to walk in her footsteps.
