PASTORNOTES

After Easter, after the empty tomb, after all the bunny eggs have hopefully been accounted, for and the chocolate consumed, we settle into a new season. It feels strangely like the old one, just warmer. The work-load does not diminish, sports schedules just change their names, school activities ramp up for year's end and summer plans demand attention. Folks look longingly ahead for vacation, face-in-the-lake time.

So it is with Halfway Creek. We made it through the year's anniversaries, and did well. Like Jesus followers on the road, walking *away* from Jerusalem and the mysterious event on Easter morning, we are liable to see nothing more than the ordinary in our path. We believe in God's promise of new life. In the ordinary, there are new opportunities for resurrection everywhere we step, all along the path.

I see signs of new life: new members, new visitors, new ideas for what the church can do, a sense, finally, of new energy. We have new people coming forward to lead, and provide energy where others have spent all of theirs. This means that the whole body is renewing, not all at the same rate, but coming along.

There has been lots of tending of the garden of faith. It is like spring outside: it will not come up just the way it was in the garden last year, but in new and resilient ways. Our challenge is to see beauty and life in what is new, surprising and different, as well as in the dependable ways and history that brought us to this point.

Faith involves paying close attention. In the garden I hang upside down to identify what birds or wind have planted for me and where, what has wintered well, or become compost. Like Easter travelers leaving Jerusalem, we do not want to miss the new life among us, just because it does not look like what we remember.

This time before a new pastor joins the congregation is even more important than the past year. It is a time when we try out, and practice, how we will be together and with new leadership. Just as we are settling into the building more, we are settling into what we need as a new church. Like a young person outgrowing shoes, some things don't feel right and we keep adjusting to our not so small, not so rural setting. It takes work to shift from the urgency and deadlines of a major building project to the slower tasks of untangling how we do things in ways that honor and protect all that has been created.

Jesus is here, in the very lovely body that is Halfway Creek. Greet someone you do not know well. Thank a Sunday school teacher, give thanks to a Holmen's Hope worker, admire the decades of being present of a seasoned member, ask a student what they will do this summer thank the board for their vision. Count the cows, wonder at this beautiful place, and its heart, and what it might be in months and years ahead. See Jesus and new life in this garden, everywhere. We started the meeting with introductions.

Pastor Wollam led us in a devotion using the book "We Make the Road by Walking."

Jen gave us an update on the call committee process. The Call Committee has interviewed three candidates and have narrowed it down to two candidates. The call committee still need to make reference checks and are hoping to be able to present a candidate to the Vision Board soon.

Bob gave us a financial update including the current balance of the bank accounts. We discussed the Stewardship program as well as ways to promote simply giving such as including simply giving forms with the quarterly giving statements. Rich called the meeting to order at 6:38 pm

Pastor Wollam led us in devotion. Each member reflected on something currently going on in his life. Pastor led a prayer for all members and circumstances mentioned.

A motion was brought to approve the minutes from the February 23 Vision Board meeting by Bob. Rick seconded the motion. The motion was approved.

A motion was brought by Jen to approve Joe Noth as president and Joanne Nichols as secretary with Rich Berger continuing as vice president and Bob Bandoli as treasurer. Bob seconded the motion. The motion was approved. It was noted we should have one or two additional members on the board.

We discussed the difference in responsibilities between a congregational member and an employee. Most of the church staff has these dual roles. The responsibilities as an employee should be put first.

Bob gave us an update on finances. Carolyn Bjerke is reorganizing the chart of accounts in QuickBooks. We discussed providing more financial information in the bulletin and newsletter.

Rich brought a motion to adjourn. Jen seconded the motion. Meeting adjourned.
