FROM PASTOR CHRIS

"And they lived happily ever after." "And they rode off into the sunset." "The end."

These are all great ways of ending stories, and all ways that Mark chose not to end his gospel. If you take what many believe the original ending of Mark's gospel at 16:8, the story stops abruptly and seems unfinished.

The women go to the tomb of Jesus and find that nothing is like they expected. The tomb is empty! When they get there, the large stone sealing the tomb is already rolled away. As they peek inside, they look to the right and see, sitting there, a young man clothed in white. "You're looking for Jesus of Nazareth," he says. "He is not here, he has been raised!"

The women respond in terror and amazement. Mary, Mary, and Salome go out from the tomb, fleeing! "And they did not tell anyone anything because they were afraid." (*The end*.)

Wait, what is that?! Mark can't end there. This is big news and the world, or at least Jesus' disciples, need to be told about this! And that is precisely the point. The story ends unfinished. And now it's our story to tell!

We have heard the good news and will we, then, be scared and keep it untold? No, we must live it, tell it, be transformed by it as we, ourselves go forward. Jesus lives! And we will see him as we seek to live his way, work to bring his kingdom into the lives of those around us, and work to bring his kingdom into our own hearts.

The story cannot end at the tomb. And it does not! We know and are certain, because of Jesus – because of his life and ministry, because of his extreme suffering, because of his

victory over death and his resurrection – that there is nowhere we can go, no experience we can face, where Jesus is not with us.

When our lives take us where Jesus trod – with the sick, the ones needing forgiveness, the ones needing to be fed – even in terrible suffering unto death, we know that Jesus chooses to walk with us. And where Jesus goes, no matter what is faced in those places, new life will always come. God will always bring us, with Jesus, to new and abundant life. The good news cannot go unshared.

"And they did not tell anyone anything because they were afraid." For us, the story doesn't end there. That "ending" is a call to action. We are the ones who continue the narrative, spreading the message of Christ's love and embodying his teachings in our daily lives.

You see it in all the ways this congregation is alive and active in the community: As we send our youth to the Gathering this summer, as we stock the food cupboard in town, bring food to the salvation army, feed kids through Holmen's Hope backpack project, visit people in the nursing homes, bring communion to our members at home, when we tell little ones "you're welcome here," when our work or volunteering brings more justice, more equity, more love into the world – you see it. When life-giving relationships are cultivated and created, you see us embodying Christ in our daily lives.

The tomb is empty, and the story is far from over. It's our turn to write the next chapter, carrying the message of Jesus' love and resurrection into the world. With Jesus walking beside us, we can face any challenge and bring new life to those around us. As the story continues in your own life and in our life together, what amazing chapters await?

Devotion: Watched a short video that challenges us to think about how we welcome and do we really welcome "all"??!

Approval of Agenda: Motion made and 2nd to approve revised agenda

Welcome to new members: Bette, Nancy, Carrie and Nicole. Amy not a review of the constitution.

Actions since last meeting:

Motion made and seconded to approve January 11, 2024 VB meeting minutes. Approved January 15, 2024.

Motion made and seconded to replace stove in parsonage. Approved February 13, 2024.

Motion made and seconded that Pastor's declared housing allowance remain the same as 2023 at \$42806. Approved February 8, 2024.

Call to order following HCLC Annual Cemetery Meeting. Purpose: To welcome newly elected VB members (Bette, Nancy, Carrie and Nicole) and to elect officers for the next year.

Motion made and seconded to elect Patti Happel as president. Approved Motion made and seconded to elect Carrie Payne as treasurer. Approved. Kari Washburn will remain as vice president. Amy Noel will remain as secretary. Andrea Baxter will be the backup. Next meeting will be March 7, 2024 at 6PM.

Thank you to past VB members, Gaye Johnson, Mike Martin and Diane Jostad! Meeting adjourned.

Motion made and seconded to approve minutes of February 4, 2023 VB meeting. Approved

Pastor's Report received

Successful pizza fundraiser!! Thank you HCLC for buying more pizzas than Journey.

Beginning of LENT - Services, weekly suppers and reflections from the book and video "24 Hours ThatChange the World" by Adam Hamilton.

Started conversations with Synod Office on our process of discerning possible ministry changes at HCLC for 2025.

Financial Report received

Recommendation to pay back the money we borrow from Dedicated Funds, to meet expenses, quarterly by taking money out Thrivent Funds.

So far in 2024 (January and February), we have had to use \$5730.86 in other financial sources (Thrivent and borrowing from Dedicated Funds).

Noisy Offering

March: LWR Hurricane Kits (This will support the National Youth Gathering Service Project). April: Youth going to National Youth Gathering May: TBD

Worship and Liturgy: VB requests that this team bring forward a recommendation for a summer schedule to our April VB meeting.

Property Team:

After conversation with our tenants in the parsonage, the motion was made and seconded to keep the rent at \$1850 with regular evaluation of proper lawn care. Approved.

In addition to replacing the stove, work was done to repair the shower at the parsonage.

Mike Martin has offered to mow lawn for another year.

A generous donor will cover the costs of repairs on parking lot lights.

Building Repairs:

Appeal to repair the windows is off to a good start. A generous donor has offered to match up to \$13,500.

Congregational Meeting scheduled April 14, 2024 at 10AM. Motion for review: "Approve a contract with Krause Construction for repair work on the Church."

The question has come up on whether we will acknowledge individuals for contributions to the window project. **Recommendation**: We will continue as we have and do not plan to publicly and/or individually list members who have given gifts to the church.

Old Business:

Followup on congregant email of concern: **Recommendation** - Find ways for kids to participate in services and feel welcome and build relationships with parents. Several ideas discussed.

Synod Assembly - Still need to find two representatives for the June 7th evening and all day on June 8th event at Three Bears Lodge in Warrens. Caucus meeting is coming up on April 14th to begin preparation for those attending. Sunday worship will again be at Riverside Park on June 9th.

New Business:

Exploring a Shared Ministry model next step: In followup to Pastor's meeting with the Synod, the Executive Committee (Pastor, Patti and Kari) will meet to start to establish a plan of how to move forward. Two upcoming weddings: August 2024 and sometime in 2025.

Began conversation on how we might begin the process of becoming a "Reconciling In Christ" Congregation and further defining the "all" of our mission statement.

Closed with the Lord's Prayer. Meeting adjourned at 8:36.

BUILDING REPAIR PROJECT-UPDATE

Not only have people been donating to the Windows Project, but also to the whole repair project we outlined last fall. This project consists of 5 Priority items summarized here:

- 1) Brick repair on two pilasters on southeast corner. Estimated COST: \$2,750
- 2) Scrape, repair, caulk and paint windows on church. Estimated COST: \$10,250
- 3) Clean, dampen and Tuck point with mortar. Cut out and re-caulk all Masonry joints that are currently caulked on brick. Estimated COST: \$14,375
- Waterproof ENTIRE church with two coats of clear base sealant. Estimated COST: \$10,240
- 5) Power Wash Church/Paint NE side and replace door (On hold)

The total needed to complete 1-4 is \$37,627. So far we have collected **\$31,505** which includes a generous matching funds donation that is being used to match funds collected for items 1 & 2 (Window Project—Maintaining the Legacy). If we can raise the remaining **\$6,627**, the match will be complete the project will be fully funded!
