HALFWAY CREEK LUTHERAN CHURCH VISION BOARD MEETING MINUTES - July 11, 2024

MEMBERS PRESENT: Patti Happel, Amy Noel, Carrie Payne, Bette Pedretti, Nicole Stumlin Kari Washburn, Andrea Baxter and Nancy Holley

ABSENT: Pastor Chris Sesvold

Call to order @ 6:10PM

Approval of Agenda: Motion made and 2nd to approve agenda.

Actions since last meeting: Motion made and seconded to approve June 13, 2024 VB meeting minutes. Approved June 22, 2024.

Financial Report Received: Jodi Anderson, Bookkeeper, was here to share report and answer questions.

- Current average monthly expenses: \$18,962
- Current average monthly offerings: \$12,759
- 2024 monthly giving to support the general fund is down approximately \$1334 compared to giving in 2023.
- Through July 11, we have used \$15,300 from the Thrivent fund to pay our bills.
- Approximate balance of Thrivent account as of July 11 is \$13,600.

At the Feb. 4, 2024 annual meeting, the congregation voted to explore a shared ministry model. A group was formed under the leadership of President Patti Happel to do this work. They were invited to the this meeting to share what they learned and to give a recommendation. Members present: Patti Happel, Mike Martin, Lynn Wenger, Kathi Hagel. Cassie Tolvstad was not able to be here tonight. Some of their work included:

- 1. Meeting with Holmen Lutheran to explore pastoral partnerships. After further review and discussion the Holmen council has declined.
- 2. Conversation with the bishop which included the opportunity to explore Synod Appointed Ministers, which are lay people who have taken extra training.
- 3. Bishop also shared what other churches are doing that are in a similar financial situation. Some of those options included: half time positions, use of Supply pastors, and/or increasing to a 2 or 3 point parish.
- 4. Internet searches
- 5. They discussed pros and cons of several possibilities.

Recommendation: Explore half time pastor position for HCLC. They shared a proposed job description of 20-25 salaried hours per week.

We thanked them for their faithful investigation and discernment. Lynn offered a prayer.

Halfway Creek Lutheran Cemetery Association Special Meeting September 29

The Halfway Creek Lutheran Cemetery Association will hold a brief Special Meeting following the 9:00 church service on Sunday, September 29, in the Halfway Creek Lutheran Church sanctuary. The meeting will begin at approximately 10:00. All members of the Halfway Creek Lutheran Church and/or those who have purchased lots in the cemetery or directly descended from someone buried there are members of the Cemetery Association.

The purpose of the meeting is to vote on the following amendment to the Halfway Creek Lutheran Cemetery Association Constitution to later be ratified at the Annual Meeting in February 2025:

Change the wording in Article V from: "The trustees must be members of the association, members of the Halfway Creek Lutheran Church, and residents of the state of Wisconsin" to "The trustees must be members of the association <u>and/or</u> members of the Halfway Creek Lutheran Church, and residents of the state of Wisconsin." This change would allow for members of the association who are not members of the congregation to serve as trustees.

The following amendments to the Halfway Creek Lutheran Cemetery Association Bylaws will also be presented for approval to immediately go into effect:

- Change the wording in Section II.C. from: "A single gravesite may be used for up to four cremations. However, all of the names must be on one monument for a single gravesite." to "A single gravesite may be used for up to four cremations or one full casket burial. No more than one monument shall be placed on a single gravesite."
- Add the following Rules and Regulations to Section V:
 - ♦ All new monuments placed in the cemetery must be above ground. No at ground level or below ground monuments will be allowed.
 - Due to the proximity of Halfway Creek to the cemetery, green burials will not be allowed.
 - No food may be left at gravesites.
