It's back! Join us for a Pet Blessing on Sunday, October 6

In honor of the Feast of St. Francis, we will be holding a **Pet Blessing on Sunday**, October 6th from 9 to 9:30 AM. The Feast of St. Francis of Assisi is observed on Oct. 4th. St. Francis was an Italian friar who took a vow of poverty and cared for the poor. He also believed nature - including its creatures - was the mirror of God. He preached that it is our duty to protect and enjoy nature as both the stewards of God's creation and as creatures ourselves. In 1979, Pope John Paul II declared St. Francis to be the Patron of Ecology.

Many ELCA congregations celebrate the wonders of God's creation and the legacy of St. Francis by holding pet-blessing services and activities for the community around this time of the year. It is a time to remember how God's creatures - of all sizes. shapes and species - bless our lives and are essential to the environment that sustains all living things, including humankind. We commit ourselves to caring for their wellbeing in the world whether they be service animals, pets, domesticated animals, wild animals, pets in shelters, bugs or creatures that fly, crawl, run or swim.

Our Pet Blessing will be held outdoors in the upper parking lot on Sunday, October 6th beginning at 9 AM with a short 5 minute prayer service and then individual pet blessings until 9:30 AM. We welcome animals of all kinds! WE ASK THAT ALL ANIMALS BE CONTAINED; EITHER ON A LEASH OR INSIDE A PET CARRIER. We also ask that attendees be responsible for picking up any animal waste left by their pet in our parking lot.

Call to order at 6:05PM. Devotion led by Patti Happel.

Approval of Agenda: Motion made and 2nd to approve revised agenda. Motion passed.

Actions since last meeting:

8/18/24 Approval of August Vision Board meeting minutes via email. **9/3/24** Approval to replace dishwasher @ parsonage via email.

Financial Report received

- Continuing to rely of Thrivent funds to pay monthly expenses. Thrivent accounts must maintain a \$1000 minimum in each of the two accounts.
- Recommendation made and endorsed to send statements of giving out three times per vear instead of four.
- The Synod has guidelines for payment to pastors who are willing to support us for emergency pastoral care.

Noisy Offering:

- October Little Heart Project spearheaded by Kathleen Jensen, a former Administrative Assistant here at HCLC. This will include volunteer opportunities when she joins us for worship on October 27th.
- November Wafer Food Pantry in partnership with Holmen High School FFA.
- December Unsheltered in our community with a focus supporting the ministry of Karuna House in La Crosse. https://www.karunahousing.org/

OLD BUSINESS:

- God's Work Our Hands was September 8 at the Holmen Band shell. There was an
 incredible response to the request for school supplies. Each of the four elementary
 schools in Holmen received four boxes of supplies. An offering of over \$700 went to the
 unpaid school lunch fund. Next year we will be responsible for the worship service and
 coffee/donuts before the service.
- Amy has been working with a group of eleven volunteers, making calls to members, giving updates on what's happening here at HCLC. Overall, there has been a positive response to those we have talked to.
- VB will develop a plan later this year to update our membership roles.

NEW BUSINESS

- There is a baptism planned this Sunday. Patti has been in conversation with another couple on a possible future baptism.
- Sunday School & Confirmation: A meeting on September 15 for all parents/guardians/ families is planned to seek input on the schedule and curriculum for the upcoming year. We are aware that background checks should be done on all SS/Confirmation volunteers. Several may already have done this through their place of employment and we will work on a plan for the rest. Will consider other education for this group, i.e. mandatory reporting and/or safety training.
- Worship Schedule: A motion made and seconded to endorse the Music and Liturgy
 Team recommendation for a 2PM and 4PM service on Christmas Eve. Motion passed.
 The VB will look at creating a online opportunity for Christmas Day.
- A motion was made and seconded to allow the local 4H to meet at the church on Sunday afternoons through October. Discussion: With our approval, we will ask the leader to review the Building Use Policy. Motion passed.
- We have supply pastors scheduled to cover most Sundays until the end of the year. Thank you Shari for your work in continuing to support the ministry of HCLC.
- Script Sales are still available to the congregation. Shari will provide education in the next newsletter on what and how to purchase online and designate HCLC as the beneficiary.
- We have been approached by one of the local funeral homes offering to provide an educational session on funeral planning. Bette will investigate outreach opportunity further.

The Little Heart Project aims to prevent suicide one crocheted heart at a time through serendipitous words of encouragement. The Little Heart Project is people leaving small knitted or crocheted hearts with a note of encouragement wherever one goes; whether it be the grocery store, the library, the gas station, your hometown coffee shop or bar, the Empire State Building, or the Great Wall of China. In January 2024, Kathleen Jensen was recognized in the Wisconsin State Assembly as being a Hometown Hero for her work in the community.

ELCA WORLD HUNGER CELEBRATING 50

For I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you welcomed me. –Matthew 25:35

ELCA World Hunger serves communities in over 60 countries around the world. The work of the ELCA World Hunger includes: food security, food pantries, soup kitchens, sustainable development, healthcare, income generation, clean water, education, health clinics and microloans.

ELCA World Hunger is a practical investment to help communities improve health and develop sustainable changes to impact the well-being of the community. They work with the local people to understand the local culture and use the systems/ resources already in place in the community to support their efforts such as existing churches. The World Hunger program is not a quick fix. They walk side by side with the community, provide crisis relief but also stay for an extended period (sometimes years) to establish services and ensure success in developing long term results.

As of 2018 ELCA World Hunger was active in 61 countries and 43 states/ territories. That is a total of 104.

OUR HCLC CHALLENGE FOR OCTOBER AND NOVEMBER: collect a total of 208 food items. For every 2 food items we receive we will "eliminate" a country/state from the World Hunger list that is posted by the collection box in the church lobby. We invite you to please help us eliminate hunger throughout the world!

October's food collection will focus on ELCA World Food Day, which is October 15th. Our October collection will be donated to local food pantries in Holmen.

November's food collection will focus on a joint collection with a Holmen FFA student project. Donations will go to WAFER.
