WHO DOES HCLC SERVE WITH OUR FOOD DONATIONS?

Did you ever wonder where your donated food goes from HCLC? Do you know the difference between a food pantry and a food bank? Do you know someone who could use some assist with groceries?

Our donated food goes to the area food pantries listed below, which serve Holmen and the surrounding areas. We also donate some items to the Hunger Task Force, which is a food bank.

A food pantry distributes food items directly to individuals or families in need.

A food bank, is an umbrella organization. The food bank collects, sorts and distributes the food to a variety of meal sites, pantries, shelters and appropriate locations within our communities.

Holmen Area Food Pantry: St. Elizabeth's Church 515 N Main, Holmen

Open: Tuesday and Friday 9-11 am

Serves: Anyone in Holmen and the surrounding area.

Most needed food items year-round: Cereal, oatmeal, complete pancake mix and syrup. Crackers, peanut butter, canned fruit, pasta and sauce. Sides: pasta or rice, Helpers, stuffing, mashed potatoes. Canned meals: stew, Chili and chunky soup.

Holmen Lutheran Church Food Pantry: 228 Morris St, Holmen

Open: Monday through Friday 8am-5pm; Saturday 8am-12pm

Serves: Anyone in Holmen and the surrounding area.

Most needed items year-round: Paper products, detergent, canned meats, canned pasta, stews, soup, baking items and staples.

Wafer Food Pantry: 1603 George Street La Crosse

One of several government commodity outlets in La Crosse County.

November 2024 Currents

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Open: Monday through Friday 10am-12:45 pm; Mon, Tues, Thursday 4pm-7:45pm.

Serves: La Crosse County (and WI residents.) There are income guidelines and application process (available on-line.)

Most needed items year-round: Soups, tuna, peanut butter, mac and cheese, cereal (not family size), breakfast food, protein bars. Hygiene items: smaller bottles of shampoo, body wash, toothpaste etc.

Hunger Task Force: 1240 Clinton Street La Crosse

Open: Monday through Friday 8am-3pm (to drop off monetary or food donations.)

Serves: The Hunger Task Force (HTF) coordinates donations from approximately 520 donors and food drives. It distributes food to over 120 meal sites, food pantries, youth programs, and outreach sites in La Crosse, Vernon, Trempealeau, Monroe, Houston, Winona and Allamakee Counties. In 2023, over 2,500,000 pounds of food was “recovered” and distributed to their partner agencies. The HTF is free and local. They do not charge recipient programs for the food.

Most needed items: Peanut butter, canned fruits, canned meats, beans (of all kinds), pasta and sauce, rice, canned soups, oatmeal, cereal and complete pancake mix.

Please consider donating to HCLC food collection. It is one of the ways to fulfill our mission to: Reach Out, Share Christ with All.

BLESSING OF THE QUILTS

In 2024 the quilters completed almost 30 quilts. Beulah Sanders donated a lot of the fabric that Amy used to make at least 15 quilt tops! Other fabric was donated or purchased for the remaining quilts.



Each February and March, quilters meet to sew the quilt tops and bottoms together and then use yarn to tie the layers together.

The quilts will be on display at church on **Sunday, November 10th.**

We'll be blessing the quilts and sending them to the Salvation Army, where they will be distributed locally to those in need as the weather turns colder. The group is excited to start their next session of sewing and tying quilts in February 2025. Call to order at 6:01PM. Devotion led by Patti Happel.

Approval of Agenda: Motion made and 2nd to approve revised agenda. Motion passed.

Actions since last meeting:

- ♦ **9/24/24** Approval of September Vision Board meeting minutes via email.

Financial Report received

- ♦ Recommendation made and endorsed to send statements of giving out three times (end of April, September and December) per year instead of four. Will add Vanco form for electronic giving to next mailing. That will give members of the congregation an opportunity to either sign up or make updates to their giving.
- ♦ The Synod has guidelines for payment to pastors who are willing to support us for emergency pastoral care. Patti has been in contact with several pastors who are willing to help us in this way. Reminder to congregation that if something is needed either call the office or reach out to Patti Happel at 608-317-9525.
- ♦ First 2025 budget planning meeting is set for November 2, 2024 at 9AM.
- ♦ Last month we made a recommendation on Portico insurance for a pastor. Since we have no pastor, no action was needed.

Noisy Offering:

- ♦ October - Little Heart Project spearheaded by Kathleen Jensen, a former Administrative Assistant here at HCLC. This will include volunteer opportunities when she joins us for worship on October 27th. Shari will add a brief description of the program to the bulletin and ENews over the next couple of weeks.
- ♦ November - Wafer Food Pantry in partnership with Holmen High School FFA.
- ♦ December - Unsheltered in our community with a focus supporting the ministry of Karuna House in La Crosse. <https://www.karunahousing.org/>
- ♦ We have had a great response to our food collection over the last month. Thank you!

OLD BUSINESS:

- ♦ Sunday School will be the 1st and 2nd Sunday of the month at 9:15. Confirmation will be the 3rd and 4th Wednesday for one hour. Confirmants are always welcome on Sunday morning. Good parent/guardian response so far. Background checks are in progress for all SS and Confirmation teachers.
- ♦ Trunk or Treat is coming up on October 26th. We have 20 trunks signed up plus games and refreshments planned. Some of our recent confirmants will be canvassing the area handing out postcards of invitation. THANK YOU!

- ♦ A motion was made and seconded to allow the local 4H to meet at the church on Sunday afternoons for more dates beyond what was approved in September. Discussion: The leader has reviewed the building use policy. The group is also willing to work on a project for the church. Motion passed.
- ♦ Recent craft weekend was a huge success with a contribution to both our operating costs and food pantry. Thank you Shari and Jodi!!

NEW BUSINESS

- ♦ We have a request for a wedding in July 2025. Next step: We will consult the Synod for advice on how to manage their request for an outside pastor.
- ♦ Journey Lutheran contacted us to participate in another pizza fundraiser. We will seek a volunteer to coordinate the HCLC contribution.
- ♦ “Blessing of the Quilts” will be scheduled for November 10th. The following Sunday, November 17th, will be the “Blessing of the Hunters”.
- ♦ Will plan to decorate the Christmas tree during SS on December 1st. Everyone is welcome to it is ready for first Sunday of Advent at the 10AM service.
- ♦ We began planning a fun video that will be available on Christmas Day focused on a favorite Christmas story and music.
- ♦ Bette will organize our ELCA Good Gifts fund raising program in December. This is an opportunity to give toward buying an animal, a hygiene kit, or stock a backpack with food in nations all over the world. There is a great catalog to chose from. - ♦ We have gotten good feedback on the messages shared by the supply pastors who have helped us over the past few months. We will continue to strategize how to keep our services in a reasonable timeframe.

FUTURE BUSINESS

HALFWAY CREEK LUTHERAN CHURCH CEMETERY NEWS

[1 Thessalonians 5:16-18](#), “Rejoice always, pray continually, give thanks in all circumstances; for this is God’s will for you in Christ Jesus.”

November, the month to be grateful, but also to remember our Veterans. Halfway Creek Lutheran Church Cemetery has several veterans from all the various wars. Hannah Scholze was stated: “History is not just found in old documents and photographs, but can also be found in cemeteries—where the past is literally buried beneath our feet.” If you have had the honor to participate in a burial of a veteran, the folding of the flag, 21-gun salute and the traditional playing of Taps leaves a haunting spirit within your heart. Take time to walk through the cemetery, notice the many flags that are scattered throughout the gravesites. See if you can locate the Granum headstone.

Oscar Granum was the third son born to Oliver and Nellie Granum of Sweden Coulee. He joined the Army in May 1918 and left to go overseas the following July as a Private with Company G of the 53rd Infantry. He experienced seven weeks of active duty at the front in Alsace and was stationed in the Argonne Forest at the time the Armistice was signed on November 11, 1918. While still in France, Oscar became sick with spinal meningitis and passed away on February 12, 1919. His brother, Henry Granum, was also serving

in France as part of the American Expeditionary Force at the time. Oscar was initially buried in an American Cemetery in Recey, France, before his body was returned to Holmen for reburial in June 1921.

The Taps bugle call to go to sleep:

*Day is done, gone the sun,
From the hills, from the lake, from the skies.
All is well, safely rest, God is nigh.
Go to sleep, peaceful sleep, may the soldier
or sailor, God keep. On the land or the deep,
Safe in sleep.*

In the storms of life, God is our only hope. His faithfulness and His goodness are present even during the darkest storm. It might not happen immediately, but thankfulness grows as we cling to Him. We are grateful not only for the joys of restored health and overcoming grief, but for the sorrows that brought us to a place of utter dependence on Jesus.



Irvin was a veteran of the U.S. Navy, having served from June 1944 until July 1946 on the USS Grimes in the Pacific Theatre. His shipmates referred to him as "Norway" since he would speak his Norwegian language to passing ships.
